
# American Pro Porch Flooring Installation Guidelines

## Preparation:

Use standard joists with a maximum spacing of 12" center to center.



Slope the joists away from the structure at a rate of 1/4" per foot.

### **Tooling and Fasteners:**

Use pneumatic or electric nail guns or screw guns.


Use trim head screws or serrated nails as fasteners.

Recommended screws: minimum #7 x 2" 305 stainless steel trim head screws with #17 drill point.


Recommended nails: minimum 2" barbed or serrated steel cleat "T" nails or "L" cleats.

#### **Installation Process:**

- 1. Start with the groove side of the boards against the structure or at the outer edge of the porch if boards run perpendicular to the structure.
- 2. Fasten the first board through the face into the joists, close to the structure.



3. Attach the board at each joist by driving a fastener through the tongue at a 30-45 degree angle (countersink screws for the next board).



- 4. Insert the grooved edge of the next board over the exposed tongue.
- 5. Adjust the gap between the boards for the desired look and maintain it consistently.
- 6. Attach the board at each joist with a fastener through the tongue as before.
- 7. Repeat steps 3-6 until you reach the edge of the porch. The final board may need to be modified to fit.

#### **Notes on Expansion / Contraction:**

Keep end butts and miters tight.

If installing in temperatures below 32°F (not recommended), leave a 1/16" gap.
